## **COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS**

Today we celebrate the fifty-seventh Commencement exercises of Indiana University Northwest, representing the culmination and proud recognition of our graduates' academic achievements.

The ceremony is rich in academic tradition and protocol and includes a Commencement address by the president, remarks by other speakers, the conferral of degrees, and the induction of graduates into the IU Alumni Association.

#### ACADEMIC ATTIRE

All candidates for degrees and those who hold these degrees, including university officials, faculty, and visiting dignitaries, are attired in traditional caps and gowns.

#### Caps

Candidates for degrees wear square caps (called mortarboards) adorned with tassels that reflect the school from which they are graduating. These tassel colors, which are largely standard across the United States, are:

Arts and Sciences—White
Business and Economics—Drab
Dental Education—Lilac
Education—Light Blue
Health Professions—Kelly Green
Labor Studies—Nile Green
Nursing—Apricot
Public and Environmental
Affairs—Peacock Blue
Social Work—Citron

#### Gowns

The gowns for bachelor's and associate degree recipients have a closed front and open sleeves. The master's degree gown has extremely long, closed sleeves, from which the arms extend through a slit at the wrist; the end of the sleeve is square, with an arc cut away just above the bottom. The doctoral gown has velvet panels down the front and voluminous bell-shaped sleeves, on which there are three velvet bars.

#### Hoods

Master's degree candidates wear hoods, which are not actually head coverings but stoles, edged in velvet and lined in satin, which flow down the wearer's back. The color of the velvet edging reflects the academic discipline; the satin lining reflects the institution granting the degree. Thus, Indiana University hoods are lined in cream and crimson. Doctoral hoods, worn by many faculty members, use the same system of color symbolism but are longer and wider than master's hoods.

#### **Honor Cords**

Indiana University is proud of all of its graduates, and is especially proud of those who have excelled academically. Candidates who are graduating with distinction, high distinction, and highest distinction are entitled to wear honor cords (sometimes called fourragères) pinned to the left shoulder of the gowns. In addition, on some campuses, qualified students are entitled to wear gold medallions indicating that they are graduating with honors. The requirements for graduating with honors are different for each school.

Honor Cords for Honor Societies Graduates who are members of nearly 60 nationally recognized honor societies may wear their societies' honor cords or medallions during Commencement.

Honor Cords for Veterans and Service Members Graduating students who have served or are currently serving in the U.S. Armed Forces wear red, white, and blue cords.

## THE HISTORY OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The academic costume of today has a history of nearly eight centuries. Students in the medieval universities of Paris, Bologna, Oxford, and Cambridge organized themselves into guilds; their usual garb, a long gown, was probably necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings. Scholars, who were generally members of church orders, wore these robes along with hoods to protect their shaved heads. Later, they wore skullcaps to protect their heads, and the hood developed into a cape that they could pull over their heads for extra protection in unpleasant weather. As additional universities were founded, their faculties adapted distinctive forms of the gown and hood for bachelors (apprentices of arts), masters (teachers), and doctors (teachers who had completed postgraduate studies), which were marked mostly by differences among the hoods. These differences were regulated by strict rules; tailors who departed from the authorized design could be punished. Finally, when caps and hats came into fashion in the fifteenth century, the hoods became ornamental, draped over the shoulders and down the back.

The academic hat was adapted from the headgear worn by ordinary people and began as a symbol of the master's degree. It took various forms: some caps were stiff and some were soft; some were square and some were round with a tuft in the center. The modern tassel is an elaboration of the tuft, and the mortarboard style comes to us from Oxford.

When academic costume came to America in 1754, styles were quite varied. In Europe, they still are, but in the United States, standardized rules for academic regalia were enacted in 1895 with the passage of the Intercollegiate Code (updated in 1932 and 1959). The code, created by an intercollegiate commission, prescribed the cut, style, and materials of the gowns and the colors that were to represent the different fields of learning.


## HONORARY DEGREE CANDIDATE

## THE HONORABLE ROBERT D. RUCKER

Robert Rucker was the 105th justice of the Indiana Supreme Court. He was appointed to the post by Indiana Governor Frank O'Bannon in 1999 and served as an Indiana Supreme Court justice until his retirement in 2017.

Born in Canton, Georgia, Rucker grew up in Gary. He supported his education at Indiana University Northwest by working in the local steel mills. His college education was interrupted by his service in the Vietnam War with the First Cavalry Division of the U.S. Army, where he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal and the Purple Heart. Rucker returned to IU Northwest and earned a Bachelor of Arts in 1974. He then attended Valparaiso University, earning a Doctor of Jurisprudence in 1976. He also holds a Master of Laws degree from the University of Virginia School of Law.

Before joining the Indiana Supreme Court, where he was the second African American justice to serve, Rucker served as a judge on the Indiana Court of Appeals, to which he was appointed in 1991 by Governor Evan Bayh. He was the first African American appellate judge in Indiana. While on the Court of Appeals, he served as vice chair of the Indiana Commission for Continuing Legal Education.



As a lawyer, Rucker served on the boards of directors of the Indiana Trial Lawyers Association and the Northwest Indiana Legal Services Organization. He also served as a deputy prosecuting attorney for Lake County, Indiana, and as the attorney for the city of Gary. He had a general legal practice in East Chicago, Indiana.

Rucker authored more than 450 majority opinions and issued more than 100 dissents during his tenure on both the Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court. During his long and distinguished career, he was known for his dedication to increasing diversity in the legal profession. He appointed numerous women and lawyers of color to serve on various boards and commissions. He consistently hired lawyers of color to serve as law clerks on the Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court.

In recognition of Rucker's lifetime of contributions to Northwest Indiana and to the legal profession, in 2010, the Lake County, Indiana, Commissioners named the courthouse in downtown Gary, home to several Lake County Superior Courts, the Robert D. Rucker Courthouse.

Rucker's past and present memberships include the American Bar Association, the Indiana Judges Association, the Indiana State Bar Association, and the Marion County Bar Association. He is a fellow of the Indianapolis Bar Foundation and a previous Lake County Judicial Nominating Commission chair. He has also served as chair of the National Bar Association's Judicial Council. His many honors include Valparaiso University's Outstanding Alumni Achievement Award and being named a Sagamore of the Wabash by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb.

William J. Lowe, professor of history and former chancellor of Indiana University Northwest, says, "Justice Rucker's experiences up through his graduation at IU Northwest were early markers of the commitment and persistence that he would demonstrate in a legal career characterized by demanding standards and achievements that are accurately described as historic for the state of Indiana. As a scholar, a distinguished jurist, and an engaged citizen, Justice Rucker opened the door for opportunity, equity, and inclusion, to enhance and improve the lives and prospects for those least advantaged in our society."
